Sloyd: Level 1

Purchase supplies and organize them so they are easily accessible.

Read through pages 1-7 in the book to gain a general idea of the purpose and how to go about the lessons. This will also give you an understanding of how you can adapt supplies to fit our time. For example, "Gummed Parquetry" is equivalent to 1" circle label stickers, and "Gummed Stars" are similar to gold foil star stickers. You can also substitute scotch tape or stapling in some places for pasting and threading. (i.e., on the "wall pocket" you can tape the pieces together where they join as opposed to stitching.)

Keep the page of images for each of the first-year models for reference while working on models (see Appendices).

- Allow time for loading and viewing videos. We recommend teachers preview tutorials and work a model before teaching it.
- Before each lesson, gather needed materials as listed at the beginning of each day's lesson plan.
- Introduce students to their Sloyd tools (talk about their care and safe use). Refresh students on how to use a ruler (note where "0" starts) and how to use the edge to draw a straight line.

How To Teach



Overview

Lessons will go much more smoothly if you prepare thoroughly. As students gain experience, develop fine motor skills, and practice habits of precision they will need less support.



Prepare

Watch video tutorials or make the model yourself. Gather supplies and materials needed.



Recap

Connect back to previous lesson and skills learned.



Read

Read the instructions one step at a time. Model each step and make sure students complete it with precision before moving to the next step.



Practice

When a project is complete, students may repeat it as many times as they wish to give as gifts or create original patterns similar to the project.
